

The Song of Moses

Exodus 15:1-21

The Big Idea: Christ conquers our enemy! Sing and make music in your heart to God.

Read the passage

Story Summary for Children:

After crossing the Red Sea on dry ground and watching God conquer Pharaoh's army, Moses and the Israelites celebrated what God had done. They wrote and sang a song of praise about God's love and power. As they sang the song, Miriam and the women of Israel danced.

Family Lesson Discussion Questions:

1. How did the Israelites respond to God's marvelous rescue?
2. What are some great things that God has done for you?
3. Can you make them into a song? Try it.

Memory Verse: "Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord." (Ephesians 5:19b)

Parents: Talk with your family about the great things God has done for you and your family. Encourage your children to sit down and compose a short poem, focusing on God's goodness, mercy and strength.

A Look Ahead: Next week the passage is Exodus 15:22-17:7 and the Big Idea will be, "Christ alone is our bread and water (we depend on him daily)." Ask your family, "What do you need every day?" You may also want to read next week's passage with your child and start explaining the story.
